Robin Cantrell (Dancer/Teaching Artist/Choreographer) is a native of St. Paul, Minnesota, and has been a member of Battery Dance Company since 2008. She previously danced with City Ballet of San Diego, Ballet Deviare, and Rioult. Cantrell has performed, taught and presented her own choreography with BDC in more than 35 countries on five continents. She also directs Indelible, her own performing arts company and co-leads 'The Duet-Project'. She holds a BFA in ballet performance and a degree in anthropology from the University of Utah.



Mira Cook (Dancer/Teaching Artist/Choreographer) joined Battery Dance Company in 2010 and has toured to more than 30 countries. A native of Austin, Texas, she studied and performed with Ballet Austin and the Austin Dance Ensemble. She went on to join City Ballet of San Diego and has performed and toured with Liss Fain Dance. She is co-director of the international dance-film project, Trans-Continental Dance Collaborative and co-leads 'The Duet Project'. Mira is also a singer/composer and has performed her work in NYC and has released solo albums, "Signs" and "Broken Bones".



Clement Mensah (Dancer/Teaching Artist) Battery Dance Company's newest member was born and raised in Ghana before moving to the Netherlands. Clement has danced with the Student Performing Group at the Alvin Ailey School, was an apprentice with Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company and has danced with Elisa Monte Dance Company, Reggie Wilson/Fist and Heel Performance Group, and Ronald K. Brown/Evidence A Dance Company. He has also performed as a guest artist with Jose Limón Dance Company. Clement has an MA in Dance Performance from the Trinity Laban School of Contemporary Music and Dance in London.
